

## Table to Judging Worksheet's Abbreviations

### Novice Worksheet

#### Heeling (the dog's 5 faults of heeling):

**L** = Lag.  
**F** = Forge.  
**S** = Straight in line with the direction of the handler.  
**C** = Crowd.  
**W** = Wide.

#### Handler errors during heeling:

**NA** = Noticeably Accelerate (the Fast).  
**BA** = Motions of the **B**ody that **A**id the dog.  
**ND** = Noticeably Decelerate (the Slow).  
**NB** = Not returning to a **B** brisk pace after the **S**low.

**PS** = Poor Sit.  
**NS** = No Sit.

#### Recall:

**EC** = Extra Command.  
**NF** = No Front.  
**Out** = **O**ut of reach from the handler.  
**T** = Touched the handler.

### Open Worksheet

All abbreviations on the Open sheets are the same as Novice.

### Utility Worksheet

All abbreviations on the Utility sheets are the same as Novice.

In addition...

#### Scent Discrimination:

**M** = Metal article.  
**L** = Leather article.  
**D** = Handler opts to send the dog **D**irectly to the articles.  
**S** = Handler opts to send the dog after a **S**it to the articles.

#### Directed Jumping:

The "grid" numbers are points off in relation to where the dog ends up after the Go-Out past the 10 foot minimum.

### Non-Regular Worksheets

All abbreviations on the Non-Regular sheets are the same as Novice, Open and Utility as the exercises are the same.

There is one exception and that is on the Brace worksheet and Brace Group sheet...

In Brace the handler may choose if the brace is to be coupled or not. What ever the choice, that will apply to **ALL** exercises. To keep track of what the handler chooses during the individual exercises, circle the **Y** (Yes, coupled) or **N** (Not coupled) on the individual sheet as they enter the ring. This way you can transfer the information to the Group sheet and double-check as they line-up for the groups.
